It is my humble honor and privilege to lead the incredible team of educators at Hillsboro High School into our new school year! This will be my 25th year in education and I don't believe that I have ever had more excitement and anticipation for opening school than this year. - 3) **Building a Strong Sense of Community & Fun.** Last but not least, you will see a strong focus this year on deepening the sense of community at Hillsboro and creating more opportunities to come together as a school and community students, parents and faculty. That will include some new traditions like tailgate parties before football games, the return of a Homecoming Dance, and more.

You can have items shipped directly via Amazon or drop supplies off in the bins in the Front Office or at Back-to-School Night on August 30.



Back-to-School Guide

As a parent, how do I know what's going on at Hillsboro?

Here are some tips for staying in the loop as a parent:

- 1. Sign-up to receive our weekly newsletter at <u>www.wearehillsboro.com/newsletter</u>. News & Notes comes out every Friday and is chock full of information. This is our primary method of communication to parents, so be sure you subscribe!
- 2. Check the Hillsboro PTSO website <u>www.wearehillsboro.com</u>. It is updated regularly.
- 3. Follow us on social media. Three must-haves: Facebook @HillsboroPTSO, Instagram @HillsboroBurros, Twitter @HillsboroBurros.
- 4. Make sure you're on the school call-out list. Dr. Pelham sends major school announcements out through this system, so you want to be on it! Check your preferences via the Family Portal at <u>https://familyportal.mnps.org/campus/portal/nashville.jsp.</u>

How can I get involved as a parent in the school?

Hillsboro benefits from a very active parent community. For more information about the PTSO and upcoming needs/activities/events, subscribe to our weekly newsletter. What is this whole A day/B day thing?

Hillsboro is on an eight-period A/B block schedule. Block scheduling allows more uninterrupted time for indepth learning and helps students manage their workload by not having assignments in all eight classes due every day.

Students take four classes every day, alternating between A day and B day classes. Classes meet for @75 minutes. Check <u>www.wearehillsboro.com</u> for a calendar of A/B days. If a day is missed for whatever reason - be that inclement weather, etc. - we do not make up the day but rather stick to the district-wide calendar.

What do I do if there is a problem with my student's schedule?

Every student is enrolled in one of four academies - Freshman Academy (all 9th graders), the Global Health & Science Academy, the Business Academy, or the IB Academy. Each academy has its own school counselor who will handle the needs of the students in that academy - including scheduling.

For schedule issues/change requests, HHS uses a paper request form. The forms will be available in all academy offices for students to fill out and take home to get signed by a parent or guardian before returning to their academy office. Email requests are not honored, and the forms will be available for pick up after one A day and one B day have passed.

Please be aware that the start of each semester is exceptionally busy for the counselors as they balance many schedule change requests. It may take a few days for them to respond, but that does NOT mean they aren't on it! If a few days goes by and you don't feel you are getting anywhere, contact the Dean of Students or Principal of your student's academy. They may be able to help troubleshoot. You can also visit the Hillsboro Counseling website for resources (www.hhscounseling.com).

How do I monitor my student's grades?

At Hillsboro, we use two important platforms - *Infinite Campus and Schoology*. Infinite Campus is the MNPS family portal. From here, you can access a wealth of information, including changing your contact information, opting into our call-out system, and monitoring report card grades. Schoology, however, will be what teachers use day-to-day to post class materials, assignments, etc. Students will also find grades to tests/quizzes/homework there.

We encourage all students and parents to use both of these resources. One positive that came out of COVID is that we all got better at leveraging technology available to stay on top of academic progress.

One important note - you will need an access code to sign-up for a parent account on Schoology. Anyone at the school can give you this code, such as your child's teachers, their homeroom/PLT teacher, or their

counselor. You can also contact our librarians Joyce Claassen (joyce.claassen@mnps.org) or Jill Hutchinson (gillian.hutchinson@mnps.org).

Please keep in mind that for both Infinite Campus and Schoology there are apps that you can download to your phone as well as websites you can access. Sometimes the information on the app is truncated. Additional data and information can sometimes be found on via the website version.

How do I contact my student's teachers? Will they share information with parents regularly?

A full list of faculty members and their emails can be found in Schoology and a full directory is available at <u>www.wearehillsboro.com</u>. Most teachers also share periodic updates with parents and may share additional resources or ways to contact them. Everyone at Hillsboro aims to respond to any family inquiries within 48 hours. If that isn't happening or you need to escalate an issue, contact the counselor, Dean of Students or Principal of your academy. You can also reach out via our<u>Burro Box</u> if you need additional assistance.

What is this whole "academy" thing? When do you pick one? What is it? How does it work?

The best way to think about the academies is to think of them as a mechanism for creating smaller learning communities where every student is known and where rich, cross-sector teaching and learning take place. It allows students to have all the trappings of a large school (expansive athletics, robust arts, extracurricular options, diverse course/faculty options) and also the benefits of a smaller school where they can get more individualized attention.

All 9th graders are part of the Freshman Academy. At the end of their freshman year, they will pick the academy and pathway that that interests them most. They choose from one of three academies:

- Business Academy
- Global Health Sciences Academy
- IBDP Academy

Within each academy, there are multiple pathways to pick from. A pathway is a series of elective courses that a student takes during their sophomore, junior, and senior year. For example, a student In the Business Academy who chooses the Marketing Pathway will take Marketing I, Marketing II, and Marketing III during those years. Those three classes are the only academy focused classes a student takes. The academies and pathways are NOT what used to be called "vocational school." Rather, this structure provides an opportunity for our teachers to get to know your student well through a consecutive sequence of classes, and for your student to experience real-life connections with the academic skills they are developing at school.

Remember – even if you do not pick the IBDP Academy, you can still take IB classes, and separate and apart from IB options, there are honors/advanced academic options for almost every academic content area.

Teachers are also assigned to academies. That enables them to co-plan so that whether your student is in Math or English or Science, there are cross-content connections that make what students are learning much deeper and more engaging.

Is IB the only way to do advanced academics?

No! This is one of the common misconceptions about Hillsboro. First, every student at Hillsboro is an IB student. We are an IB World School (one of very few in the region). That means our entire faculty is trained in the IB methodology and approach, and you will see evidence of that in many ways across our school. We also operate both the IB Middle Years Program (which all 9th and 10th graders participate in). From there, we have three additional options if your student wishes to continue on an IB-intensive pathway:

- **IB Diploma Programme (IBDP).** This is the most rigorous of the pathways. Students are enrolled in all IB classes for all areas of study. If they select this option, they will be part of the IBDP Academy. Depending on the college and the score they earn on their final IB tests, students can earn college credit for IB classes.
- **IB Career-related Programme (IBCP).** This is for students who want rigorous, IB options but who may not want to take IB-level classes for every subject. In this instance, they will enroll in either our Global Health & Sciences Academy, our Business Academy or the STEM Pathway within the IBDP
- Advanced STEM. This is for students interested in science, technology and math. They are dual enrolled in the IB Career-Related program (IBCP).

It's important to understand that IB classes are NOT the only advanced academic classes offered at Hillsboro. We offer honors classes for most content areas. We also offer many Advanced Placement (AP) classes (like IB, AP classes are college level courses where students can earn college credit) and a number of Dual Enrollment classes (where a student takes a college-level course and earns college credit while still in high school). Honors, IB, AP and Dual Enrollment classes are open to any student who wishes to take them.

In addition, Hillsboro also offers the I**nterdisciplinary Science & Research (ISR) program**. This is a great program for students who are willing and able to pursue science at a high level. ISR is a sister program to the School for Science and Math at Vanderbilt (SSMV). Both are collaborations between the Vanderbilt Center for Science Outreach and MNPS. Bottom line, few schools in Nashville offer a greater selection of advanced academics than Hillsboro and unlike many, our courses and programs are open to any student willing and able to put the effort in.

My student is sick. What do I do? Who do I notify?

If your student is sick, please email Mr. Holder at <u>carlos.holder@mnps.org</u> or send a note with your student once they return to school.

I need to pick my student up early for an appointment. How/where do I sign them out?

Students must be signed out in the front office by a parent or guardian.

My student is late. Where do they go? Do I need to come in or send a note?

Students sign in at the Business Office. This office is to the left once students enter the lobby from Burro Boulevard (near the cafeteria). Parents do not need to come in with students. Parents can send in a note with the student if they are tardy because of an appointment.

My student is getting his/her learner's permit. How do I get the required paperwork?

Students can find the paperwork they need in any Academy Office or from Mr. Holder in the Business Office. The Business Office is located on the first floor near the cafeteria (to the left when you enter from Burro Boulevard).

My student turned 16. How do they get a parking spot?

We have ample student parking available on campus but you must be 16 and register for a parking permit. See Carlos Holder in the Business Office to obtain a parking permit.

My student is interested in playing sports. Where do they find information about try outs, contact information, etc.?

Hillsboro's athletics program is one of the best in the city. We offer a host of school and club sports. Information about Fall sports is included in this packet, but real time information is also available on the PTSO website at <u>www.wearehillsboro.com/athletics/</u>. You will find contact information for all coaches there as well as tryout information and more. Look for additional, real-time information in our weekly newsletter and/or the PTSO's social media accounts

What clubs/extracurriculars are offered at Hillsboro and how do students get involved?

One of the great parts of Hillsboro is that there is something for everyone here – from sports to music and the arts and everything in between. In total, we have 50+ extracurricular activities. We also make it easy for all students to participate by having a longer lunch block during which many clubs meet.

We strongly urge all students to join and participate in one of our many clubs/activities. A current list of clubs and sponsors is included in this packet but a real-time list is always available on the PTSO website at <u>www.wearehillsboro.com/clubs-organizations/</u>. Look for additional, real-time information in our weekly newsletter and/or the PTSO's social media accounts. How do laptops work at Hillsboro?

Every student will be issued a laptop during the first week of school. That laptop is their responsibility for the balance of the school year. Students should bring their school-issued laptop to school each day as they are used in most classes for classwork, tests, etc. If you have trouble with your laptop, go to the Hillsboro Library and they will help trouble-shoot (<u>https://www.burrolibrary.com</u>).

Should students bring their laptops to school every day?

Absolutely yes. We are proud to now be a 1:1 school. Every student in the building having their own laptop opens many opportunities for students and teachers alike. They can take notes on their laptops, keep up with assignments digitally, follow along to presentations on their laptop, and much more. Students should bring their computer to school every day <u>fully charged</u> and plan to use it as their primary learning device. In addition, they will often have access to e-textbooks rather than old-school textbooks they have to lug to and from school.

One thing that is important is that students will need to learn strategies for keeping digital work organized on their computers so they can find what they need when they need it. This is a challenge for many students, but a deeply valuable lesson to learn for their long-term success.

Are there school supplies students need to buy/bring on the first day?

In high school, school supplies are minimal and will mainly be issued by your student's teachers. In the first week of school, teachers will review the syllabuses for their classes and discuss any other recommended or required resources. Bottom line - there Is no need to purchase school supplies before the beginning of school. The most important tool Is the school-issued laptop, so they should bring that along with a notebook and pen/pencil to write with.

We do ask families, however, to contribute to the teacher supply drive. You can purchase things teachers need for their classrooms via our Amazon Wish List (<u>https://amzn.to/3yyqAYN</u>) and have them shipped directly to us or you can purchase similar items and drop them off in the bins of the main office or at the PTSO table at Back-to-School Night on August 30th.

What is the dress code at Hillsboro?

While Hillsboro does not require students to wear Standard School Attire as many other MNPS schools require, we do have a dress code. If you violate the dress code, you will be asked to change, call home and/or visit the clothes closet. Specific dress code guidelines are:

- Shorts/skirts must be fingertip length.
- Tears/holes cannot be above fingertip length.
- There can be no visible undergarments, tube tops or crop tops of any kind.
- There can be no inappropriate images on clothing (i.e. offensive, illegal, etc.).

Student Device Policy and Procedure 2022-2023

All HHS students will be provided a device, and it will be checked out to the student in the Laptop Checkout System.

Students may opt to use a personal device, as aligned with MNPS Procedure 6.312.1p

1. School Responsibilities

- Submit tech tickets for broken and damaged devices
- Check out/return devices in Laptop Checkout System
- Collect device if student leaves MNPS or transfers to a charter school
- Collect fees associated with lost, stolen, or intentionally damaged devices

2. Parent/Guardian Responsibilities

- Complete MNPS Code of Conduct and agree to and follow applicable MNPS policies and procedures
- Upon withdrawal from MNPS, ensure device is returned to school, MNPS Enrollment Center, or Family Information Center
- Assume cost of repair or replacement at the date of loss if the device is
 - Not returned
 - Intentionally damaged
 - Lost because of negligence
 - Stolen, but not reported to a school and/or police in a timely manner

3. Student Responsibilities

- Bring device to school, fully charged each day
- Use device for instructional purposes at school and use good judgement online
- Use device in the appropriate manner and take care that device is not lost or damaged
- Protect login information; never share username and password
- If device is lost or stolen, report it to the school within one school day
- In device is damaged, report it to the school within one school day

Withdrawing from MNPS

If the device is not returned, a police report will be filed for a stolen device. The school will place a hold on the student's record, including the replacement fee, and the Cumulative Record will be held. The hold will be removed upon the device being returned or compensation.

- Total Replacement of Device: \$200
- LCD Screen Replacement: \$40
- Keyboard Replacement: \$17
- Laptop Charger: \$15

HHS Student Parking Pass & Gate Pass Rules & Expectations 2022-2023

- 1. Hillsboro High School is not responsible for any damages to, or theft from vehicles parked on school grounds.
- 2. Student vehicles must have a valid decal on display.
- 3. Parking decals are non-transferrable.
- 4. Students are responsible for informing the AGHS office of a change in vehicle.
- 5. Upon arrival to school, students must come directly into the building. Loitering in the parking lot is not permissible.
- 6. Follow all campus speed limits of 10 MPH. Reckless driving (spinning tires, unnecessary acceleration, speeding, transporting others outside of the vehicle, jumping curbs, etc.) is not permissible.
- 7. Students may not leave school grounds without authorization during the school day.
- 8. Students must maintain a passing grade for 6 out of 8 classes for every 9 weeks.
- 9. Students must maintain absences under a minimum of 10 total absences.
- 10.Students must arrive to school on time.

Failure to follow the above rules and expectations could result in disciplinary action, including ISS, OSS, and/or revocation of parking permit depending on the infraction.

Gate passes are the property of Hillsboro High School. Lost Gate Passes cost \$10 to replace. Failure to turn in your assigned Gate Pass at the end of the school year will result in a \$10 fine.





Hillsboro High School Parking and Traffic

2022-2023

Good news! We are at the end of our construction and so we are in the traffic and parking plan that we expect to use for years moving forward. Please see the attached map. It is very important that we ALL FOLLOW THE PLAN. The plan is designed to help make traffic and parking both efficient and safe.

- General Notes
 - The Burro Blvd is intended for drop off and pick up at appointed times. Beyond this the gate will be closed. Visitor traffic and parking should come to the main entrance off Hillsboro Rd and park in the visitor parking by the WeGo bus terminal
 - Student drivers must have a parking pass and be registered with the school. Parking on campus is a privilege and can be revoked
 - Anticipate traffic. If you arrive for drop off by 6:45am you should not experience significant delays. If you are arriving after 6:50 you should expect delays.
 - Burro Blvd is one way only after you pass the entrance to the garage. At this point it splits to two lanes
 - The North Loop is for accessible bus and parent drop off only. This is for our students who are not as ambulatory or who have special needs. Please be respectful of this.
 - The visitor parking area by the main entrance is NOT a drop off zone.
- Mornings
 - Students who are approved to park on campus should enter the Burro Blvd from Glen Echo and park in the garage. Parking is first come first served.
 - Parents dropping off should pull all the way forward as far as possible in the drop off zone before stopping to drop off children. If you stop to early you will back up traffic. The drop off zone extends from the first cross walk all the way to the end of Burro Blvd
 - Parents dropping off will exit to Richard Jones Rd.
 - Students who are car riders or drivers will enter the school at the East Entrance
 - Yellow MNPS Bus riders will enter the school at the West or South entrance
 - \circ $\,$ WeGo City bus riders will enter the school from the Main entrance
- Afternoons
 - We will open the gate to the Burro Blvd between 1:30 and 1:45. Cars should pull all the way forward to the front of the pick up zone
 - Yellow MNPS buses will have priority. Cars will be held at the pickup zone while buses are moving

We know that traffic in Green Hills can be challenging on a good day. We ask that you be respectful of the businesses and property owners near us. We want to be good neighbors to them.
